Discussion

The overlay is focused on new construction or significant remodeling (that approaches new construction).

Believe that the neighborhood boundaries included in the national historic district work well for defining the protective overlay boundaries. Extending the overlay to include the west side of 5th street was discussed.

Sallie cautioned that committee members should be open to some level of government regulation in zoning. The protective overlay will be a form of regulation to protect the neighborhood.

Decisions

Carol R proposed that we change the quorum requirement for PSC decisions from 30% to 50%. Discussed and unanimously agreed. The PSC charter will be updated to reflect the change.

Next meeting will be April 18 at 7:00 PM at Matchbox. Two decisions required for that meeting: boundaries for the protective overlay, approve the draft of the city council resolution for APC to engage and develop the overlay.
