Survey link emailed to 183 unique email addresses and was opened by 103 for a 56.3% open rate.




Response

- Survey link emailed to 183 unique email addresses and was opened by 103 for a 56.3% open rate.
- There were 64 survey responses in total.
- 59 responses came from property owners in Highland Park
- Responses came from 53 unique addresses out of around 170 possible indicating that 31% of households responded.

Answered: 63 Skipped: 1



Answered: 64 Skipped: 0




